

THE OTTAWA INQUIRY

Ottawa, July 6.—It was shown before the Royal Purchasing Commission today that another Ottawa retail druggist, T. A. Brownie, who was "on the inside" in government circles, secured a handsome make-off from war contracts. He bought 150 hospital boxes from the National Drug Company which the government could have purchased wholesale for \$11,250. He did not open or inspect the boxes, hardly had anything to do with them other than to collect the returns but, when the government bought them from him, he was paid \$17,205. His patriotism was represented by a profit of \$6,055.

Stewart McClenaghan sold "housewives" to the government at fifty-three cents, and secured a contract for 100,000 cents for them. He only paid forty-four cents for them.
