LIFE INSURANCE

TAKEN ON EMPLOYES

The Studebaker Corporation Generously Enlarges Scope of Workingmen's Personal Welfare Work.

Under an arrangement in effect with one of the largest and strongest risk companies the Studebaker Corporation has placed life insurance for a substantial sum upon each one of its employees. This does not include office men, but refers only to those in the work-shops of the different plants. The amount of insurance placed for each individual is sufficient to provide for sickness and funeral expenses and still leave a comfortable balance for other immediate needs of the beneficiaries.

The insuring company is the Equitable Life Assurance Society of the United States, the policy being on the new group plan recently inaugurated by this risk concern and increases in value with each additional year in effect. The Studebaker Corporation in the first automobile manufacturer to afford its employees this protection. As the insurance will eventually cover from eight to ten thousand work men, meaning an expenditure of thousands of dollars annually for the premium fee, the extent of the interest taken by the Studebaker Corporation in the welfare of its employees can be readily appreciated.

The arrangement dispenses with the usual physical examination required for life insurance, through acceptance of the examination which every Studebaker workman must undergo before being given employment. This is in line with the policy of the institution to surround its men with clean, healthful and sanitary conditions.

Not only length of employment matters, the only requirement is that the insured person shall have been on the rolls of the corporation when taken upon the policy. No expense whatever attaches to the insured; all being borne by the Studebaker corporation.

Of recent years there has been a general tendency on the part of employers, and in particular the larger ones, to bring about a closer and more intimate relationship between employer and employee. It was a movement inspired by humanitarianism and given impetus by splendid results rapidly attained. Sanitary conditions were improved, the work environment was made more pleasant. The effect was that the men worked in better spirit and with more energy, and in the same amount of time than under the old order of things.

In time the system was extended so as to include the homes of the workmen. In them was inculcated a spirit for better living, with a view to getting all the enjoyment there is to be found in life.

The Studebaker corporation has been greatly interested in this principle for years, due in all probability to the fact that it is a manufacturer of automobiles.

ANOTHER ADDITION FOR FORD PLANT—\$60,000

Ford (Ont.), July 30—Work on another new addition to the plant of the Ford Motor Company of Canada, at an estimated cost of \$60,000, has been started. It will extend for 105 feet along the Detroit river frontage.

Hardly had the concrete work on the recently completed \$300,000 factory addition become dry when it was decided to start the present work. The newest building will be a story high of concrete with a steel "saw tooth" roof. It will be devoted entirely to machine shop work.

Although over 150 Ford cars per day are being turned out by this plant—running at capacity—there has not been kept pace with orders, and the new machine shop will allow a swifter output.

To insure solid foundation on the river bank, 450 piles are being driven deep and concrete sunk on top of these. Two hundred machines were ordered for the new building even before the ground was broken.

While these improvements are going on, a large addition to the company's power plant, which will more than double its capacity, is also under way.
