RUSSIAN TRADE MAY BE RESUMED

Head of English Shipping Corporation Looks for Activity in Baltic.

(Montreal Gazette.)

An early resumption of shipping connections between Great Britain and Russia is looked for by Mr. L. H. G. Walford, head of Leopold Walford & Co. (London), Ltd., which company operates about sixty ships and has extensive connections with this continent, with Europe and the Mediterranean in transportation matters. Mr. Walford, accompanied by Mrs. Walford, is at the Ritz-Carlton for a few days and, although he stated that his trip is primarily one of rest and pleasure, he is taking the opportunity of coming into contact with branch offices on this continent. Already he has visited Baltimore, Philadelphia and New York, and yesterday he had a trip around the port of Montreal on invitation of Mr. M. P. Fennell, Jr., and Mr. F. W. Cowie, being accompanied by Mr. J. J. McEgan and Mr. D. C. McEgan, who have charge of the Montreal office in the Coristine Building. Mr. Walford stated that the British Government is anxious to see the Baltic trade revived, and he believed things would soon be sufficiently settled for that to come about.

As to general conditions over in England in relation to shipping, Mr. Walford said there was plenty of raw material, but so long as labor is in its present unsettled state cargoes are bound to be scarce, since merchants are unable to get orders. The American loan would ease the French exchange situation, and already, he said, France was beginning to export, and with stable government in France, the exchange improvement should continue.

Mr. Walford intimated that he was very desirous of extending operations with Canada, for he had unbounded faith in this country. His company had linked Montreal and Canada up with Ireland this year, and he believed that little country might be cultivated with advantage, though, like many other countries, it needed long credits if its trade was to be sought.

The Leopold Walford (London), Ltd., did a great business for the British and French governments during the war in

REPORTER SHOT

Danbury, Conn., Nov. 7.—Arthur V. Donahue, a reporter of the Staff of the New York American died in a hospital here early today from a bullet wound received about midnight last in Newtown. A police alarm has been sent out for two men, one of whom fired the shot that killed Donahue.

The young man was visiting at Newtown and had started to walk home with Edward F. Pitzschler, his brother-in-law, from the latter's barber shop when the two came upon an automobile standing in the middle of the road without lights. Considering the automobile a menace to traffic they moved it several yards to the edge of the road.

According to Pitzschler, two men then came out of an adjoining lot, and one of them fired three shots with a rifle. One of the shots found Donahue, who fell with a bullet in his back. The two men entered their automobile and drove off quickly in the direction of Bridgeport. Investigation later showed that the two strangers had been engaged in stealing gasoline from a state highway department tank nearby.

RIFLES STOLEN

London, Nov. 7.—Several hundred rounds of ammunition and several rifles have been stolen, supposedly by Sinn Feiners, from the Orange Hall, in the Cowcaddens district of Glasgow, according to the Daily Herald. The raid was discovered Sunday by a policeman, who found the words "Commandeered for the Irish Republican Army," chalked on the wall of the hall.
