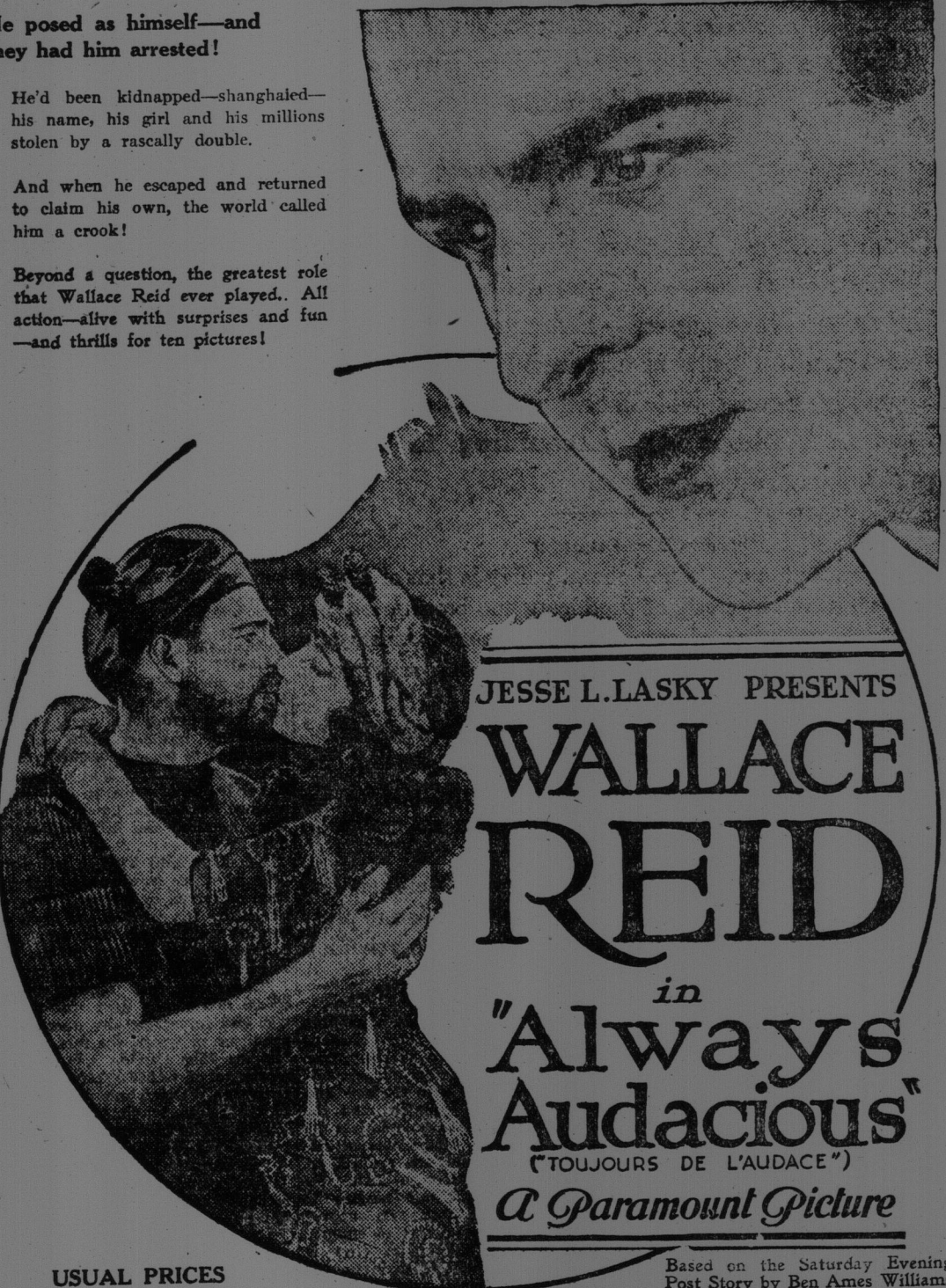

New York, Sept. 21. — In a formal
statement issued this week the General
Motors Corporation announced that the
company had decided to concentrate the
manufacture of all its expert models,
with the exception of the Cadillac and
General Motors truck, at the Canadian
plant of the corporation, General Motors
limited, located at Oshawa, Ont. The
