On the termination of the year for which the Committee were elected it affords them much pleasure to present to the Members this their Annual Report and Financial Statement, from which it will be gathered that the Society is still in a substantial, useful, and progressive position. The number of applicants for relief has not been as many as for the past few years, owing no doubt to the abundance of employment, but the amount given is a trifle in excess of last year, and this is to be accounted for from the fact that a large amount of sickness, especially of typhoid fever has prevailed; and many deaths from consumption having occurred, leaving destitute widows and families.

The funds of the Society continue to be well supported. The membership fees showing a considerable increase, while the donations to the charitable funds are largely in excess of previous years.
