BAFFLING MYSTERY OF POISON AND DEATH. Valer, Monk and Sergeant. Three Poisoners Accused of Two Murders.

ROME, Aug. 10.—The High Court at Naples is occupied with an extraordinary murder trial, in which many well-known names are involved. A millionaire duke, his duchess, and a lady's maid are alleged to have been poisoned, and a valet, monk and several other persons are mentioned as having taken some part in the tragedy.

MIDDLEBURY, N. Y., Aug. 10.—James McSorley, a former Conroy Island hotel keeper, who completed a prison sentence only a few days ago, came here today to square matters with Daniel B. Fenton, proprietor of the Hotel Edgerton, the man whom he believed was responsible for his conviction. Both McSorley and Fenton are dead tonight.
