

He went on to say, too, that not only has it been necessary to adopt this policy but the Commission have this year raised the rate of taxation from 39.64 mills to 41.25 mills, nor is there any present indication that the rate next year will be lower even under proposed largely increased valuation.

"It was a very serious mistake," said he, "on the part of the first Commission to attempt to carry on the city affairs at the reduced rate of assessment when we consider the serious condition in which the civic finances then were. The tax rate should have been increased instead of reduced during Mr. Sherman's term of office and, if that had been done, it would not now be necessary for the present Commission to increase both the valuation and the rate of taxation in order to overcome the deficit created under the first two years of Commission rule."
