EASY MONEY RATES HELPED BOOST ALONG MARKET

Price Movement Assumed Buoyant Proportions, Many Favorite Issues Scoring Early Advances.

New York, June 18.—Easy money rates again contrived measurably to the further strength of the stock market today, price movements at the outset assuming almost buoyant proportions.

These were materially shaded by heavy selling for profits before the end of the first hour, but a fresh upturn occurred after an interval of distress and hesitation.

Call money opened at 5 per cent. for market collateral, but receded to 4 1/2 per cent. by 10 o'clock.

Other loans and kindred equipments notably Lockwoods and Portland Steels, American Car and Foundry Locomotive, were consistently strong.

Industrial and utilities issues were among the stronger features of the bond market. Liberty bonds were steady and the foreign group was firm.

Old United States bonds were unchanged on call.

STORAGE PLANTS FULL OF MUCH NEEDED FOOD

Greater Quantities of Meats in Cold Storage Today Than a Year Ago—Millions of Eggs Packed Away for High Market.

Ottawa, June 18.—The Cost of Living Commissioners reports as follows to the Minister of Finance concerning goods in cold storage, and in process of care for the first of June:

Unsettled conditions in the West have somewhat delayed the report, and have made it impossible to include as complete totals as ordinary.

The butter stocks reported consist of 2,926,571 pounds of creamery, and 146,980 pounds dairy, an increase over last month of 167,500 per cent.

BULLETIN ISSUED ON WILD LIFE IN NEW YORK STATE

Friends and Foes Classified in Pamphlet by Conservation Commission.

Albany, N. Y., June 17.—"Friends and Foes of Wild Life" is the title of a bulletin just issued by the State of New York Conservation Commission.

A colored figure of a hawk in flight, bearing in its talons its prey, gives indication of the type of creatures described in the text as the "foes" of wild life.

The publication contains two colored plates by Louis Agassiz Fuertes, entitled "The Black List" and "The White List." In the black list plate, which is surrounded by a black margin, from which one may infer that its members should be placed in mourning as promptly as possible, are included pictures of crow, goshawk, Cooper's hawk, sharp-shinned hawk, great horned owl, weasel, red squirrel, red fox and hunting house cat.
