

RECORDER'S COURT—

Clerks of Common Council to be Clerks of such Courts.—
sec. 103, p. 69.

Recorder must be Barrister of five years standing and appointed only on application of City Corporation to Governor.—

Offices of Recorder and Police Magistrate may be vested in the same person, but liable to severance on application to Governor by Common Council.—sec. 105, p. 69.

RETURNING OFFICER: To administer oaths.—sec. 124, p. 75. To be Conservator of Peace during election.—sec. 157, p. 88.

His duty at an Election where a poll shall be demanded.—

Vested in Her Majesty, Corporations cannot interfere with, and Governor to have the same power over them as Municipal Corporations by this Act have over others.—sec. 192, p. 105.
