FULTON, Edward, educationist. is the s. of Joseph Fulton, by his wife, Amanda Ellis. B. at Lower Stewiacke, N.S., July 22, 1862. he was ed. at Dalhousie Coll., Halifax (B.A., with 1st rank honours in Eng. and Eng. History and Demill gold med., 1889), and took his M.A. degree at Harvard Univ., 1892. He followed a post-graduate course in Phil. at the same institution (Ph.D., 1894). In the early part of his career he was Instructor of Eng. in the Provl. Normal Sch., Truro, and in 1894 he was apptd. Instructor in Eng. at Harvard Coll. From this position he was promoted shortly afterwards to be Prof. of Eng. at Wells Coll., Aurora, N.Y., where he still is. He is an adherent of the Presb. Ch.—*Aurora, N.Y.*

FYLES, Rev. Thomas W. (Ch. of Eng.), is the s. of Thos. Fyles, of London, Eng., by his wife, Elizabeth Tearle. B. at "The Hermitage," Enfield Chase, Eng., 1832, he was ed. in London, and ordained to the ministry, 1862. He became incumbent of Iron Hill and West Brome, P.Q., 1863; of Cowansville and Sweetsburgh, 1871; rector of Missisquoi High Sch., and rector of Nelsonville, 1873; and Emigration Chaplain at Quebec for the S. P. C. K., a position he still retains, 1883. In addition to a volume of poems, Mr. F. has written numerous papers in religious, educational and scientific periodicals. He is a mem. of the editing comte. of the *Can. Entomologist*, and has served as a del.

from the Entomol. Soc. of Ont. to the Royal Soc. of Can. He was for some yrs. a mem. of the Bd. of Exams. for granting teachers diplomas, and in 1880, received from the educational comte. of the Dom. Exhn. a 1st class diploma for scientific exhibits. He is a corresp. mem. of the Nat. His. Soc., Montreal, and a Fellow of the Linnean Soc., London.—*South Quebec, P.Q.*

FYSHE, Thomas, bank manager, was b. near Edinburgh, Scot., and received his ed. in that city. After serving in the Birmingham Banking Co. as a clk., of which institution his bro. was, and still is mangr., he came to Can. and entered the branch of the Bank of B. N. A. at Kingston. Proceeding to Montreal, 1868, he was sent to N. Y., returning to Montreal, in Nov., of that year to the genl. manager's office. In Mch., 1870, he went to Toronto as acting accountant of the bank, and in 1872 returned to the office in N. Y., where he acted as second agent of the bank. In Feb., 1874, he resigned this position, and went into business in N. Y. as a private banker and broker. Later, he was apptd. agent of the Bank of N. S., in St. John, N.B. In the following year he became cashier of the institution, a position he continued to fill till his appt. as joint genl. mangr. of the Merchants' Bank of Can., June, 1897. On leaving Halifax for his new post he was presented by the staff of the Bank of N. S. with a solid silver dinner and tea service. Mr. F. was Presdt. of the Can. Banker's Assn., 1895-96. He is the author of a pamphlet: "Letters on Municipal Taxation" (1880), and of a paper on the "Growth of Corporations," in the *Can. Banker's Journal*, 1895. In religion, a Presb., he m. the dau. of Mrs. Thos. S. Leonowens, at one time lady tutor to the King of Siam, and author of "The English Governess at the Court of Siam," "Romance of the Harem," "Life and Travel in India," and of other interesting works.—211 *Drummond St., Montreal; Halifax Club.*
