the inspection of timber and lumber, for the improvement of the Postal System, and for increasing the efficiency of the North-West Mounted Police, which Your Excellency has informed us will also be submitted for our consideration.

We are gratified to learn that, the Royal Commissioners on Labour having concluded their inquiries, Your Excellency hopes to be able to lay before us at an early day their report, with the important evidence collected by them in various parts of

Canada.

Your Excellency may rest assured that these several subjects and the others which may be brought before us, shall receive our earnest consideration, and we trust with Your Excellency, that the result of our deliberations may, under the Divine Blessing, tend to promote the well-being and prosperity of Canada.

After Debate,

The question of concurrence being put thereon, it was unanimously resolved in the affirmative.
