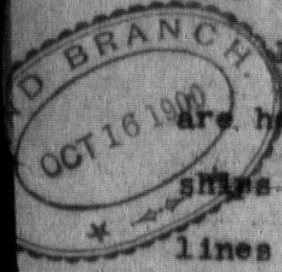

Dear Sir:-



In compliance with your request of the 5th instant, you are herewith furnished with copies of the plans of the townships of Cobden and Thompson giving the measurements on the lines abutting on the Indian Reserve. You will notice on the plan of the township of Thompson that the surveyor, Robert Gilmour, who made the survey in 1860, ran some of his lines across the Indian Reserve. The surveyor you send to subdivide the Indian Reserve had better make search for the posts planted by Mr Gilmour and either establish them by planting new posts, or destroy them if any remain, according to the necessity of his new survey, in order that there should be no mistake about the posts. It will be necessary to have the north line well defined, as you will observe it does not coincide with the quarter sections in sections thirteen and fourteen. I do not think you will require any further suggestions for the survey of the Reserve, as the plans sent you will show where the lines already surveyed abut on the boundaries of said Indian Reserve. Any further information that you may desire will be gladly furnished you.
