Whereas it is thought very necessary
for the publick safety and welfare of his Maj^{ty}
Subjects that the Indians lately deserted from Schaakhook
and places adjacent to a place on the north end of Corlaers
Lake called Missisgaleck who have of late by the
Insinuation of some bad Indians Living there made
Severall insults on his Maj^{ty}s Subjects in New England
to invite those Indians to Return to their old habitations
at Schaakhook to the end they may become our friends
and be out of the way to be guilty of doing mischief
to our neighbours. and ^{some of the} ~~to~~ ^{be put with} ~~strengthen~~ ^{our frontiers}
It is therefore Resolved that a Belt of wampum
to those deserted Indians to perform this message and
that Johannes Knickerbacker be Employed to dispatch of
messengers who at their Return shall be paid for their
trouble.
