	11 Apr./44	Tuesday	S/L A. E. Henderson (C.2312)(Admin.) was in conference with No. 3 "M" Depot today with respect to messing arrangements for personnel of that station who are at No. 4 ITS over the noon hour, being checked by the Medical Selection Board of this Station. Approximately 100 airmen, comprising graduates and the Station Band, were guests this afternoon at a matinee of "Meet the Navy".	
	12 Apr./44	Wednesday	The Commanding Officer and Station Administrative Officer conferred with the Bursar of the University today with respect to the Messing Contract, which expires 15th May/44. Messing arrangements are not satisfactory, due chiefly to inability of the University to secure a capable person to take complete charge of the kitchen and mess hall. It rather looks as though the contract will terminate. At a gathering of graduates the Commanding Officer circulated a questionnaire for completion, embodying 41 questions with respect to every angle of Station life. In order that they might feel quite free to express themselves frankly, they were specifically asked not to sign their names. It is hoped, as a result, to secure some worthwhile suggestions and constructive criticism. The Commanding Officer's Parade and Inspection was held as usual today, followed by a route march.	
	13 Apr./44	Thursday	The Commanding Officer received a telephone call this morning from the President of the University indicating his intention to submit written notice of termination of the Messing Contract. The Commanding Officer later discussed the matter with Mr. A. West, Bursar at the University, at which time the University's decision was confirmed and a letter giving one month's notice handed to the Commanding Officer. No. 4 TCHQ was advised by telephone and the Commanding Officer received instructions to proceed to No. 4 TCHQ this evening to discuss establishment required for taking over the Messing on a service basis. S/L A. S. Kirwin (C.5952)(Med.) and S/L W.C.H.W.Hammond (C.1942)(APM) were both visitors on the Station, from No. 4 TCHQ.
