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of ice to another, and now I want to strike shore somewhere, and I want to land soon. I am against coalition, and I think the Party should be grateful to Graham, Pardee and Guthrie. However, I advise that for the present at least the Party should go slowly. In my belief, a National Inventory should be taken before an attempt is made to enforce conscription. That is the only way in which we can know what to do. Unless the present confused situation is removed, I will, in the event of a dissolution, call my executive and place my views before them, and if these are not agreeable they can secure another candidate.

CANDIDATE SCHELL (South Oxford)

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I have not much to say. I am in favour of our leader Sir Wilfrid, and I am also in favour of a referendum. At the same time, I think we should congratulate our friends, Graham, Pardee and Guthrie on the stand they have taken. The Party should prepare for an election, so that we will be able to answer the question as to our reason for inviting the people to put the **present** Government out of office. The atrocious state of affairs with regard to Camp Borden should be brought to light. It would be well to form some kind of a union or a national government.

Big men should be included - men like Dr.Falconer of Toronto University. (Cries of dissent and voices "No more professors").

I am against Coalition and against extension of the life of Parliament. I favour general conscription properly applied. In the main, I agree with the position taken by Mr.Graham.
