

quantity of land cultivated by each recipient.

5th. You will be required to account for the expenditure of the above money, and to support the various items in your accounts by receipted vouchers. Certified statements of the supplies purchased and distributed by you to each Indian relieved or furnished with seed should also accompany your account; forms for the above purpose will be furnished you by the Department. These documents should be in the hands of the Department as soon as possible after the money intrusted to you has been expended. A sum not to exceed, without special authority, \$21.28, will be allowed annually to pay for medical attendance on the sick. The attendance given should be accounted for by the medical man or men, on forms of which a supply will also be furnished to you.

6th. You should confine yourself to one subject in each letter to the Department, and all your official letters should be addressed to the Deputy Superintendent General of Indian Affairs.

7th. An annual report will be required from you as to the condition of matters in your Agency, as well as a tabular statement containing statistics regarding your Indians. These documents will
