Ottawa, 29th September, 1902.

Rev. Sir:-

I wish to call your attention to the general remarks made by the General Public School Inspector Day, on the Watha Indian School on the Gibson Reserve "Teacher not well satisfied owing to small salary for mission work. He receives only \$50.00 for this. He is doing good work in school, and I believe his mission work is satisfactory. It seems to me that \$50.00 is a very small sum for his preaching etc, and a small increase would have a very soothing influence" The Inspector also states that Mr. Whitebean's salary is \$250.00. This is a mistake as he is paid \$300.00 by the Department, and it would appear from the Inspector's remarks that the \$50.00 he receives for mission work makes up the \$300.00.

Of course the Department is not concerned as to what Mr. Whitebean's salary is as missionary but it considers that it is only fair that you should be advised that the Inspector's statements as to the missionary's dissatisfaction.
