I beg to say that the Department has received your letter of the 11th instant, relative to disbursements made in connection with a loan which Amos Obediah received from Six Nations Band Funds, and I may say that it is observed that you have referred to the fact that when the original application for loan was made by this Indian he asked for \$365.00 to purchase land from Leon Obediah and \$250.00 to buy land from Harry Martin, and you referred also to a quit claim deed from George and Eva Longfish. A voucher amounting to \$365.00 in favor of George and Eva Longfish has been received covering purchase price of land for Wm. Nelson Carlow. The Department desires to be informed as to what connection if any there is between the land bought for Amos Obediah and the land purchased from George and Eva Longfish for Wm. Nelson Carlow. One copy of the voucher mentioned is returned herewith, and it should be re-enclosed with your explanations.
