FOREWORD

Widely advertised for many years Western Canada has hitherto had the first call upon the intending immigrant. Yet, on the very pathway travelled by the great tide of newcomers from the United Kingdom and the United States, is a section of rich farming country which offers larger and more varied opportunities than the West, together with conveniences and comforts that in a country entirely new are quite impossible. Canadian Currency—The standard of Canadian currency is the dollar (\$) comprising 100 cents. The value of the dollar in British currency is about 4s 2d; of the cent, $\frac{1}{2}$ d.
