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down in the New Testament by the Great Teacher, where He says: "What things soever ye desire when ye pray, believe that ye receive them and ye shall have then." And now having shown the "Fallacy of Atheism" in denying the existence and creative energy of God's Divine presence, manifested through all the operations of nature, and in denying the Divine inspiration of the scriptures, and the efficacy of prayer, all of which are based upon the immutability of natural laws. I trust that every heart and mind before me to-night, who already believe in these things, may be made stronger in their faith. And that those who do not believe will see the importance and consistency of yielding to the same conditions of faith in God that is required by the same great law of mind in yielding to the persuasions and control of the minds of their fellow men, until they shall learn the truths of Divine inspiration, and the efficacy of prayer, from actual experience. Thanking you for the interest you have shown in this discourse, and trusting that the arguments used may have its desired effect, I leave the subject with you.
