CURRIE, Hon. James George, [Niagara.] 2nd

S. of Mr. Lachlan Currie, of the Township of Niagara, Co. Lincolu, yeoman, a native of Scotland. B. at Toronto, 24th Nov. 1827. Educated at Niagara. M. 1st June, 1854, a dan. of the late Mr. Joseph Brown, of Niagara Township. (She died in June, 1863.) Is a Barrister and Attorney at Law of U.C., and Captain in the St. Catherines Infantry. Was Warden of the county of Lincoln, and Mayor of St. Catharines from 1859 to 1862. Was an unsuccessful candidate for Niagara (town) at g. e. 1857. Elected by acclamation to Legislative Conneil, 4th Sept., 1862, for Niagara Division, vacated by the death of Hon. W. H. Merritt.—St. Catharines, C. W.

DEBEAUJEU, Lieut. Col. Hon. George Réné Saveuse. (L. M.) L. C.

Descended from Capt. Daniel C. DeBeaujeu, Chevalier of the Military Order of St. Lonis, who commanded the French forces at the battle of Monongahela, July 9th, 1755, where the English under General Braddock were defeated, and where Capt. DeBeaujeu was killed. S. of the late Hon. J. P. Savense DeBeaujeu, M. L. C. in L. C. Legislature. B. at Cotean du Lac. M. Miss DeGaspé, dau. of P. A. DeGaspé, Esq., of St. Jean Port Joli, C. E. Is Seignior of Soulanges, and of La Nouvelle Longueuil, President of the St. Jean Baptiste Society, of Montreal, and Lient. Col. (Retired) in Militia. Has succeeded to the title of the last Count DeBeaujeu, of France, who died some years since. Appointed to the Legislative Council, 21st Nov., 1848. Coteau Landing, C. E.

DICKSON, Hon. Walter H., [L. M.] C.

S. of the late Hon. W. Dickson, M. L. C. in the U. C. Legislature. B. in Canada. Is a Barrister at Law of U. C., having been called to the Bar in Hilary Term 1830. Sat for Niagara in Legislative Assembly from 1844 to 1851. Appointed to L. C., 8th Feb., 1855.—Niagara, C. W.

DUCHESNAY, Lieut. Colonel Antoine Juschereau, J. P., [La Saile.] 1st Mem. L. C.

S. of the late Colonel Michael Juschereau Duchesnay, who became at an early age an officer in the then 60th
