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## A Jersey Cow Wins in the Guelph Dairy Test

Sunbeam of Edgeley, owned by James Bagg & Sons, Edgeley, Ont., Sets a New High Record for Total Points Scored

"A JERSEY cow has won the dairy test," was the rumor that gained currency at the Guelph Winter Fair early on Monday morning, Dec. 4th, regarding the great contest between the interests of dairymen centred more than around any other feature of the fair. It was only a rumor, for Prof. Dean and his staff had still many hours to go before the contest was over, before the final results of the test could be known; but it was a correct rumor, for when, late in the afternoon, the results were given out, the Jersey cow triumphed over the great Jersey cow owned by J. B. Bagg & Son, Edgely, Ont., had not only scored the highest number of points, but had won the championship. In the third day test, she produced 195.3 lbs. milk.

*Colanatha* was the nearest solid not fat, the honors went to *Madam Pauline* Canara, owned by A. E. Hulel, Norwich. This cow also stood third in number

points south. Her yield was 19.91 lbs.; her milk row 217 lbs., testing 4.4 per cent, but her total score was 238.50, being slightly higher than the 238.00 of Cherry's great cow in the 1914 test. In the 4th place stood Princess Flo of Mideley, a daughter of Sundewm with 17.91 lbs. milk testing 4.4 per cent and a total score of 238.026. The Ayrshires did not make so good a showing as they did last year. John McKee's Scottish Nancy gave 70.3 lbs. of milk testing 4.4 per cent, for a total score of 247.1 lbs., compared with a high Ayrshire mark set last year by Turner and Sons, Lady Jane of 262 points. Amongst the best testings Ayrshires were the "farmers" testings Ayrshire and Harmon McPherson's Pearl of Balquid.

Amongst the highest testing cows were, besides those mentioned, Roberta Stamboul Morin, (255.6 points), owned by Henry Welsh, Weston; Nellie, a grade (253.02 points), Earl Grier, Woodstock; Pontiac, Alice,
