
VANCOUVER, B. C — The British Columbia Wire & Nail Company have decided to rebuild their factory destroyed by fire last week.— Part & Fee, architects, have prepared plans for a five-storey hotel to be built by A. One plan is to continue the Crows Nest road round the north end of Kootenay Lake and extend the road from Gerrard to the north arm of Arrow Lake. 
