The option markets for oats developed a weak
tone, last week, and prices in Winnipeg scored a dectine of 1c to $11 / \mathrm{c}$ per bushel and closed $3 / \mathrm{c}$ to $11 / 4 \mathrm{c}$ lower than a week ago. The decline in the Chieago market on Saturday amounted $101 \% \mathrm{cc}$ to $31 / \mathrm{c}$, pe bushel, and prices are $\% \mathrm{c}$ to $\% \mathrm{c}$ below this day. week. ## HONEY.

The tone of the market for honey remains very firm as the demand has increased and stocks on spot are very small. The demand is principally for No. 1 white clover honey in comb at 21c. to 22 c . per section, but as the offerings of such were somewhat limited the lower grades came in for attention, and sales of No. 2 white in comb were made at 19 c . to 20 c ., No. 1 brown in comb at 18 c . to 19 c ., No. 2 browh at 17 c ., and white extracted in $30-\mathrm{lb}$. pails at 18 c . to 20 c . per 1 l .

## LOCAL FLOUR.

Both domestic and country buyers appear to have ample supplies of flour on hand hence the volume of business passing is small. The mills are all busy ernment standard spring wheat flour in car lots for shipment to country points, is selling at $\$ 11.10$ per bbl. in bags, f.o.b. cars Montreal, and to city bakers at $\$ 11.20$ delivered.
Proces of wintef wheat flour remain unchanged although the tone of the market rules strong. The demand continyes steady for small lots to meet immediate requirements, and sales were made at $\$ 11.40$ to $\$ 11.50$ per bbl. in bags ex-store. There is a good inquiry for rye flour of which the offerings are limit ed and prices have been firmly maintained at the late advance with sales of broken lots at $\$ 7.20$ per tag. delivered to the trade.
The equiry for millfeed from all sources continues good, but supplies are very limited and buyers find it hard to fill their wants.

ROLLED OATS.
The market for rolled oats developed an unsettled feeling and prices were cut by some millers. The
demand for supplies for domestic account and sales were made as low as $\$ 5.30$ per bag of 90 lbs , in cotton, delivered to the trade, with some millers quoting as high as $\$ 5.50$.
