The Clerk reported that the Council had agreed to the Conference, as defired by the House. Ordered, That the Managers who managed the last Conference, do manage this Conference. And they went to the Conference.

And being returned,

Mr. Fairbanks reported that the Managers had been at the Conference, and that they had, one the Conference, communicated to the Committee of His Majesty's Council the Instructions received by them from the House, relative to the Bill for encouraging the Fisheries.

A Message from the Council by Mr. Hill:

Mr. Speaker

The Council have agreed to Two Resolutions of this House relative to Roads in the Township of Digby.

The Council have not agreed to a Bill, entitled, An Act for the encouragement of the Fisherics

of the Province.

And then the Messenger withdrew.

Mr. Blair moved, that the House do come to the following Resolution, viz.

Resolved, That it is the opinion of this House, that, for the better preservation of the Treasury Notes against Forgery, a new Plate, more difficult of imitation, and better paper, should be procured, and that the present Notes in circulation should be called in, and new Notes on such better Paper, and printed with such new Plate, issued in their place, and that this House will provide for the expense of the same: which, being seconded and put, passed in the negative.

On motion, the House resolved itself into a Committee of the whole House, to consider further of a Supply.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair,

Mr. Wells took the Chair,

Mr. Speaker relumed the Chair.

The Chairman reported from the Committee, that they had gone through the business to them referred, and that the Committee had framed a Bill for applying such part of the Supplies granted in this Session of the General Assembly, as are not already appropriated by the Laws or Ass of the Province, which they had directed him to report to the House, and he asterwards delivered the Bill in at the Clerk's Table; and thereupon,

On motion, the said Bill was read throughout a first and second time, and thereupon,

Ordered, That the Bill be engroffed.

Then the House adjourned until Monday, at ten of the Clock.
