which was on Friday last, proposed to be made to the Question, That the Bill (to amend the Act of the Parliament of Canada, passed in the twenty-sixth year of the Reign of Her Majesty, chapter 5, intituled, "An Act to restore to Roman Catholics in Upper " Canada certain rights in respect to separate schools, and to extend to the Roman Catho-"lic minority in Upper Canada, similar and equal privileges with those granted by the "Legislature to the Protestant minority in Lower Canada), be read a second time, tomorrow; and which amendment was, that the word "to-morrow" be left out, and the words "this day six months" inserted instead thereof, being read; Ordered, That the said Order be discharged.

Ordered, That the Bill be withdrawn.

A Bill to adjust the boundary lines, and to settle the titles in certain ranges of the Township of Grenville, was, according to Order, read the third time;

Resolved, That the Bill do pass.

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry the Bill to the Legislative Council, and desire their concurrence.

A Bill, from the Legislative Council, intituled, "An Act to incorporate the Bank of London, was, according to order, read the third time. Resolved, That the Bill, with the amendments, do pass. Ordered, That the Clerk do carry back the Bill to the Legislative Council, and ac-

quaint their Honors, that this House hath pageod the same, with several amendments, to which they desire their concurrence.

The Order of the Day for the third reading of the Bill to enable Joseph Robinson Bawden, to be examined by the Law Society of Upper Canada, for admission to practice as an Attorney and Solicitor, being read;

And the Question being put, That the Bill be now read the third time; the House divided : And it was resolved in the Affirmative.

The Bill was accordingly read the third time.

Resolved, That the Bill do pass, and the title be "An Act to enable Joseph Robinson "Bawden to be examined by the Law Society of Upper Canada, for admission as an "Attorney and Solicitor."

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry the Bill to the Legislative Council, and desire their concurrence.

A Bill to incorporate the Caisse d'Epargne de la Section St. Joseph de la Société de Tempérance de Montréal, was, according to order, read the third time.

Resolved, That the Bill do pass, and the title be "An Act to incorporate the Society " called La Caisse d'Epargne de la Section St. Joseph de la Société de Tempérance de " Montréal."

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry the Bill to the Legislative Council, and desire their concurrence.

A Bill, from the Legislative Council, intituled, "An Act to repeal the Act to legalize "certain assessments in the City of Toronto, and to enable the said City to recover the "taxes rated and charged," was, according to order, read the third time.

Resolved, That the Bill do pass.

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry back the Bill to the Legislative Council, and acquaint their Honors, that this House hath passed the same, without any amendment.

The Order of the Day for the third reading of the Bill, from the Legislative Council, intituled, "An Act to enable the Honorable Philip H. Moore to obtain a Patent for the "invention of a new method for manufacturing peat into coal by process of steam," being read;

And the Question being put, That the Bill be now read the third time; the House divided :---And it was resolved in the Affirmative.

The Bill was accordingly read the third time.
