GEORGE DUNDAS, Lieutenant Governor.

The Lieutenant Governor is also directed to communicate to the Legislature, Copy of a Correspondence between the Secretary of State for the Colonies and the Governor-General of Canada, on the affairs of British North America, and at the same time to express the strong and deliberate opinion of Her Majesty's Government, that it is an object much to be desired that all the British North American Colonies should agree to unite in one Government.
