TO HELP THE FARMER

In discussing the bill of the Hon. Mr. Burrell, Minister of Agriculture at Ottawa, to spend ten million dollars on behalf of agriculture over a period of ten years, Mr. J. Edwards of Frontenac said he presented a constituency which supposed was as strictly agricultural as any riding in the Dominion of Canada.

A great deal had been done in the province of Ontario, especially in last few years, in advancing the interests of agriculture by way of giving practical instruction to farmers, their own farms. He had to give personal thanks, and to convey to honorable friend the Minister of Agriculture (Mr. Burrell) the thanks of the people of Frontenac, for having acceded to his request to grant to this county a man to conduct cow-testing work. This was very important work and in his constituency the gentleman who had been appointed had regular route assigned to him, goes to the farmers, regardless of their politics, and gives instruction as many as one man is able to give instruction to. It was very pleasing to be able to state that, out of the great number of farmers who may be regarded as pupils in that particular work, only two discontinued the work, cow-testing in which they engaged the beginning of last season. He had a number of requests from other parts of the county, not covered by this man, asking for the appointment of a man to take up similar work, was an indication that the farmers desired of getting instruction and acting upon the instruction that
