
FAIR ATTENDANCE AT THE MARKET

Fresh Eggs Were Selling Today at 18 and 20 Cents per Dozen.

There was only a fair attendance at the Easter Market to-day. Compared with last Saturday the prices remained about the same. The continued cold weather and frosts this week increased the flow of sap and to-day there was a large quantity of maple syrup offered for sale, most of it selling at \$1.50 per gallon. One of two vendors asked only \$1.25 a gallon and they hadn't long to wait before they were sold out. Eggs for Easter eating sold for 18c and 20c per doz. a decrease of two cents from last week. Apples of which there was an abundance sold at from 35c to 50c a basket. Of other vegetables there was an abundance, but the prices remained the same as last week. In the ladies' department butter sold for 30c and 31c a pound. Chickens sold from 75c to \$1.50 each but sales were small. Meat remained the same as last Saturday. Beef roasts sold at from 16c to 20c, a pound and boiling prices at from 12c to 14c a pound. Fish remained unchanged.


A PLAIN CEMENT BLOCK HOUSE. DESIGNED BY CHAS. S. SEDGWICK, ARCHITECT.



On the inside, they will keep out all moisture. The illustration shows a very plain and economical house, with a frontage of 28 feet and a depth of 26 feet. An eight room house, full basement and good attic for storage. It is estimated to build this house, exclusive of heating and plumbing, for \$3,000. The first story rooms to be finished in red oak with oak floors and the second story finished in yellow pine or Washington fir, floors of oak and fir. There is one central chimney with furnace flue and flue for kitchen. There is no expensive detail, the cornice is plain and well projected and the porch of liberal size, located in the center and the main entrance door opening directly into the living room. There is one bed room on the first floor and four on the second floor, each provided with good clothes closets. The bath room is in the rear over kitchen bringing the plumbing pipes directly up. The attic stairs extend up over the main stairs with a door at the foot. The outside trimmings should be painted white and the roof shingles stained or painted red.

TRADE IN WOODEN SHOES The cost of the wood from which the shoes are made is about six dollars a cubic meter, but of which one hundred pairs of shoes are manufactured. The wholesale prices of the shoes range from ten to fifteen cents. Few of the shoes are produced by machinery, nearly all of them being made by hand by the poorer peasants of Holland.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS

ANY PERSON who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Land Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any of the following conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader in case of death or cultivation of the land in each of three years. Duties—Must reside upon and cultivate the land in each of three years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent), and cultivate 50 acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption, may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts, price \$200 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$200.00. W. W.
