DAWSON'S MARKET Shows Little Change In Past Week.

The Dawson markets have shown no changes in quotations during the past week, with the exception of a stiffening and very slight advance in the price of cream and an increase in onions.

In meats there is an abundant supply, and the prices have been steadily maintained. One reason for this is the good supply of moose and caribou that still continues to come in, and also of ptarmigan, quail, ducks and rabbits that are to be seen prominent in all the markets.

"Notice our steady sales and the general stability of prices. This is what the trade, from the experience derived from last season, desires to maintain. When the price of meats went up last spring the demand fell off to nothing. People could not afford to pay the price, and then made shift to get along on over half a supply of canned meats, taking fresh meats as a luxury only.
