AMERICAN STEAMER SEWARD TORPEDOED WITHOUT WARNING

WASHINGTON, APRIL 9—The American steamer Seward was reported torpedoed and without warning in the Mediterranean by a German submarine, in a despatch to the state department today from Consul Gaulin, at Marseilles. All of the crew of thirty-one was saved. She was built in Seattle, Washington, in 1907 and registered 3,390 tons gross; 2,880 tons net. She was 279 feet long with a beam of forty-two feet. She carried a general cargo valued at close to \$300,000.

20,000 Germans, Mexicans, Negroes and Texans Loyal

AUSTIN, Texas, April 9—The greatest public demonstration ever witnessed took place here this afternoon, when more than twenty thousand citizens of Austin and adjacent towns attested their loyalty to the American flag by forming a marching column several miles long. The procession was headed by Governor James E. Ferguson, and among the organization participating in it were many composed of negroes, and citizens of Mexican and German nationality.

Synopsis of Canadian Land Revenue
