Farm and Household.

FARM AND LIVE STOCK
NOTES.

Dip the lambs.
Ventilate the stables.
Keep the horse collars clean.
Corn is not a horse forming meal.
Don't burn old straw; run it into
manure.

Grass loses three-fourths in weight
by drying.
Kill the potato bugs; each female
lays 1,000 eggs.
Buckwheat often pays well.
Besides serving to loosen the soil.
Swing churns cannot be beaten on
any account, and they are easily kept
clean.

A steamer for cooking food will
pay for itself in two seasons on any
stock farm.
Pigs squealing for food should not
be heard, if profit or good meat be
desired. Cheaply fed pigs meat
is away in the pot and lacks quality.

Just as the first potato sprouts
show through the soil, run over the
patch with a smoothing harrow, and
you'll save much work with the weeds
later.

If hens must be confined at this
season, be sure of four things: that
they have clean quarters, good shade,
plenty of dry feed, and as much sand
and gravel as they can use.

Those who raise early lambs for
market ought to know that this can
be done much more profitably by the
help of a good root patch, than with-
out. How this is done is in the
furnishing roots, for feeding, freely
to the ewes next spring, to promote
an abundance of rich milk for the
suckling lambs. Mangle wurtzels,
because of their excellent keeping
qualities, are the best for the purpose.

All fruits that fall to the ground
should be destroyed in order to in-
crease the number of insects that in-
fest as many insects as possible.

One of the best instruments for this
purpose, which is not patented, is the
hog. Give him a chance, and he
will do his work well. For com-
pansions, the poultry would be excel-
lent.

Drain wet lands; ditch hill-sides;
then deepen your soil to the extent
of your ability.

Handle manure as lightly as possi-
ble; but handle a great deal of it.
Manure loses every time it is turned
over or piled.

Somebody says that eggs from hens
in close confinement will not hatch
well. He also advises not to select
the largest fowls to breed from.—
Little hints like this should not be
neglected by poultry breeders.

Bad flavor in milk, caused by eat-
ing flavored foods, may be removed
by adding boiling water in the pro-
portion of one pint of water to every
gallon of new milk.

Salt is an absolute necessity for
stock of all kinds in the summer.
Cows at pasture take in with the
grass 80 to 90 per cent. of water.
When fed on hay in the winter, they
get but 14 per cent. 86 per cent. of
dry solid matter in the form of hay
or grain of course contains more salt
than 10 to 20 per cent. in the form
of immature grass. And so it is that
the summer time cows are more eager
for salt than in winter. Salt is a
great aid to digestion and therefore
necessarily conducive to health.
Health is indispensable for a full pro-
duction of milk and butter. Salt, then,
must be supplied as so much neces-
sary food, and not simply as a luxury
which may be supplied or not. One
ounce daily will be taken by a cow
with benefit. Regard it as its use
is quite as indispensable as its ade-
quate supply.
