Mrs. Taylor, widow of the late John Taylor of Niagara-on-the-Lake is dead.

The annual meeting of the St. Catharines Council of Women was held yesterday afternoon at the Welland.

Last evening Citizens' Hose Company No. 1 Old Boys Association held a meeting at the Grand Central and finished up business relating to the recent banquet. It is likely an annual outing will be held August 1st.

Engineer Wicksteed of the C. N. R. was conducted over the factory district at Thorold by President Begg of the board of trade, his purpose being to report on the matter of the extension of the electric line to the south so as to serve the employees of the various plants.

Robert Dayton received a preliminary hearing at Thorold on the various charges in connection with the fire which burned him out January 31, and the case was committed. Bail was accepted for \$3,000, himself \$1,500 and David Battle a like amount.

The Chief Collector of United States Customs some time ago asked for two motorboats to patrol Niagara river above and below the Falls. The Washington authorities have turned down the request, and the collector says no drastic steps will be taken to stop liquor shipments from Canada over the border.

On the list are still two names of charter members, Peter Steep and Thomas Reid, who have been with it through all the ups and downs of its history, and are proud to be with it now in its hey day, with 250 members, owning its own valuable building, and a power in the community.

The Executive Committee of the Dominion Fire Chiefs' Association arrived in St. Thomas last evening in connection with a meeting to make necessary arrangements and set the date for the annual convention, which will be held at St. Thomas next summer. The Chiefs who are handling the preliminary details are: Chief Bethune, of Three Rivers, Chief Armstrong, of Kingston, Secretary and Chief Kappel of Stratford, Keys of Galt, Earl of Milton, Kerr of Leamington, and Heath of Saskatoon.

Beginning Sunday midnight Niagara Falls, Ont. will have daylight saving. A straw vote was taken yesterday in the big plants, and the manufacturers and employees were practically unanimously in favor of daylight. A meeting of the city council was held in the afternoon, and the Mayor will issue the proclamation today bringing daylight saving time into effect Sunday midnight. Daylight saving will be adopted in Niagara Falls, N. Y. coming into effect at the same time.

C. W. Bliss of Calgary, a guest at the Prince George, Toronto, states the prospects for good crops in Alberta are excellent. He says that there has been plenty of snow, and states that the farmers are looking for an early spring. He says that the fall wheat is in excellent shape in most places. Mr. Bliss says the reports of extreme conditions in Southern Alberta are highly colored. Conditions are undoubtedly anything but good, he says, but no one is actually starving as has been erroneously stated.

The U.F.O. which is to open a co-operative store in Welland, is now planning to invade the fruit belt. Plans are being made by the United Farmers of Ontario to construct a canning plant in the fruit belt, and to set up an opposition plant to the Dominion Canners, at present the largest canning syndicate in Canada. The cause of the trouble is according to information received, the announcement by the Dominion Canners that present contracts will be limited to two-thirds of the original amount, leaving the one-third on the hands of the producers. This third and any additional output will be taken care of by the U.F.O. Co-operative canning factory.
