

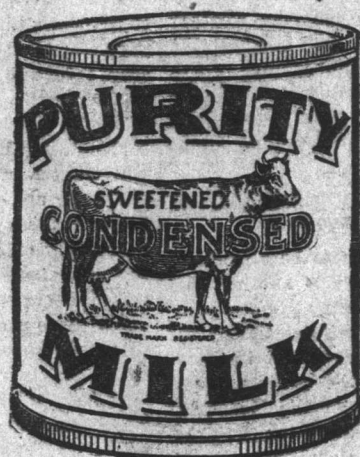

Questions Asked by Opposition.

On the Order Paper yesterday the following questions were asked:—

Mr. Higgins—To ask Hon. the Prime Minister if it is the intention of the Government to have allocations for public works under the direction of the Dept. of Public Works and the Dept. of Marine and Fisheries made upon the recommendation of the elected representatives of the various districts.

The Premier answered that any person approved of by the Government or Minister in charge of a department could make recommendation for allocations and they would receive consideration.

Mr. Walsh—To ask the Rt. Hon. the Prime Minister to lay on the Table of the House the following statements: (a) The number of men given employment at construction or any other class of work in connection with the Humber Valley Proposition between May 2d, 1922, and June 10th, 1923; (b) If any men were so employed during this period, by whom were they employed? (c) How many Newfoundlanders are now employed at this work? (d) If the passing of the Humber Bill will give immediate employment to four thousand men including those already employed? (e) If each Electoral District is to be given its proportionate per capita of the work? (f) Will the passes or employment tickets be given on recommendations of elected representatives?

The Premier replied that there were now 1003 men employed on the Humber. They were engaged by the agent of the Sir Armstrong Whitworth Co. who will attend to this work.

Mr. Walsh—To ask the Rt. Hon. the Prime Minister in the absence of the Hon. Minister of Agriculture and Mines, if it is the intention of the Government to give or make any distribution of seed potatoes the present spring.

Replying for the Minister of Agriculture the Premier said a small quantity of seed potatoes had been given out, but none were distributed free so far.

Mr. Walsh—To ask Hon. the Prime Minister if the seat of Hon. Dr. Campbell, in the Legislative Council was vacated on his becoming a candidate for the House of Assembly, according to the terms of Section 8 of the Legislative Disabilities Act, Chapter 4, Consolidated Statutes, and if not, why not; also if it was so vacated has that gentleman been re-appointed to be Honourable, and if so to lay on the Table a copy of the Commission re-appointing him; and if he has not been re-appointed, to state by what authority he took his seat in that House at the sitting last Thursday.

The Premier answered that Hon. Dr. Campbell was re-appointed to the Upper House the day that he (Mr. Walsh) was sworn in a member of the Legislature.

The questions asked by Mr. Fox in relation to the command of S.S. Watchful are answered in the proceedings published elsewhere.

Mr. James Moore asked for copies of allocations from the departments of Fisheries, Agriculture and Mines and Public Works and documents respecting same.

The Prime Minister replied he would get same by applying to the departments in person.

Sir M. P. Cashin—To ask Hon. the Prime Minister to lay on the Table a statement showing the amount expended in this Colony up to date on account of the Humber enterprise and a copy of the Order, or Orders in Council in connection with the same. A copy of the agreement with the Bank of Montreal for the loan of the said money, and a statement as to terms of repayment, etc., also a statement of the amount expended in England to date on account of the same enterprise, a copy of all correspondence with the British Government or any department thereof and with the Trade Facilities Board in relation to the same.

Will be answered at the next session.

Mr. Cashin—To ask Hon. the Minister of Marine and Fisheries to lay on the Table of the House a statement showing the amount of money allocated to Ferryland District by the Department of Marine and Fisheries, from March the 20th, 1922, to May the 31st, 1923; to give the names of the parties to whom allocated; the amount allocated to each; and what work was performed. Also the original returns sent in.
