B.C. REPUDIATE BOTH SHIELD AND PAKER

Decline to Accept it as Emblematic of the Soccer Football Championship of Canada

Once more G. Parker and the People's shield are repudiated, and henceforth the Vancouver and District Football Association will not acknowledge the trophy as the Canadian championship emblem of Canada.

The Vancouver and District association held their annual meeting at Vancouver on Tuesday night, and President Con Jones, after making a few remarks on Mr. Parker's ability and the rotten way in which the trophy had been handled since its advent, advocated that Lord Strathcona be asked to donate a trophy emblematic of the Canadian championship, and to be awarded to the team winning the Canadian championship with hard and fast rules to govern.

The meeting endorsed the remarks of Mr. Jones, and further stipulated that the Calgary Caledonians, as the recognized champions of Canada, should be given the trophy first to defend.

A resolution was consequently passed instructing the secretary of the association to write Lord Strathcona, asking him to put up a perpetual trophy for the championship of Canada, and a second resolution was passed, to be forwarded to G. A. Parker, representative of the "People's shield" in Canada, which reads as follows:

"Resolved, that the secretary be instructed to write Mr. G. A. Parker as representative of the People's shield, that owing to the unsatisfactory manner in which the competition for the trophy has been handled and the fact that the trophy is governed by more clearly defined rules and responsible trustees appointed, who will see that such rules are properly carried out, this association declines to recognize the trophy as emblematic of the championship of Canada, and that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the various provincial football organizations."
