Mr. A. White—Appeal against statute labor tax. No. 1.

Mr. J. McKinnon—Account for taking care of Charles Drummond, \$26. No. 1.

Mr. E. T. Essary—Re injuries of Mrs. Cochrane on account of defective sidewalk. No. 2.

Mr. O. E. Dore—Asking for the use of the East End Hall on Dec. 23, for the Elizabeth Street Methodist Church. Granted.

Mr. F. McMichael and 37 others—Asking that a bylaw be framed making it illegal for milk dealers to deliver milk on Sunday.

Ald. Boyd moved, seconded by Ald. Jones, that the petition be filed.

Aldermen Moule and Anderson moved that it be referred to No. 3.

The amendment was lost on the following vote: Yeas—Aldermen Wyatt, Heaman, Moule, Glass, Anderson, Bartlett and Thomas. Nays—Aldermen Taylor, O'Meara, Fitzgerald, Wallace, Skinner, Jones, Boyd, Garratt, Draney and Shaw.

The motion to file the petition was carried on the same vote reversed.
