WHITNEY UNJUST TO MUNICIPALITIES

A Searching Criticism of New Hydro Policy by Liberal Leader Rowell.

WILL RETARD PROGRESS

Declares That Hon. Adam Beck is Himself Opposed to Proposed Commission Plan.

Dundas, Jan. 9.—"As the municipalities receive the entire cost of use of the system, and are the real owners of the system, they should have a direct representative on the hydro-electric commission." This was the declaration which Mr. N. Rowell made at an enthusiastic gathering of North-western Liberals here tonight, assembled to do honor to the Legislative member-elect, Dr. James McQueen. It was a first night political banquet ever held in Dundas, the first public appearance since the election of Dr. McQueen before his constituents, and the first appearance of Mr. Rowell as Liberal leader in North Ontario.
