Nothing Known of \$20,000,000 Loan

[Canadian Press.] Paris, Aug. 21 .- No confirmation can be obtained in any quarter here of the report issuing from Mexico City that bankers of Paris and other European capitals have made an offer to Provisional President Huerta to float a new loan of \$20,009,000.

On the contrary, the report is not believed by the Banque de Paris et Pays Bas, which took a leading part in the previous loan to the Mexican Government. The story is also dis-credited that the banking house of Lazard Freres.

The French foreign office, it appears continues to take the attitude that it would be unwise for French bankers to lend money to the Mexican Government until the United States Government has recognized the Huerta Administration. While French bankers are not obliged to observe the foreign office's suggestions it is usual for them to follow hints of this sort.


MUST BOIL WATER
