Declares Liberal Party Will Control Canadian Parliament.

PREDICTS HUGE VICTORY

Warns Progressives Vital Needs of Dominion Are in Peril.

NEWARK, Ont., Dec. 4.—Upon the results of the polling in North York Tuesday depends something vastly more important than the selection of a parliamentary representative for that riding.

The transcendent issue is a vital and national one, involving not only the welfare of Canada's basic industry, but the very continuance in parliamentary practice of those constitutional principles upon which rests the political development of this Dominion.

Those facts W. I. Mackenzie King emphasized Saturday in two meetings in his home constituency at Kings City and Queensville.
