Among the large number of women running on the Labor ticket in the coming British elections is Dr. Ethel Bentham, who is one of England's foremost women physicians



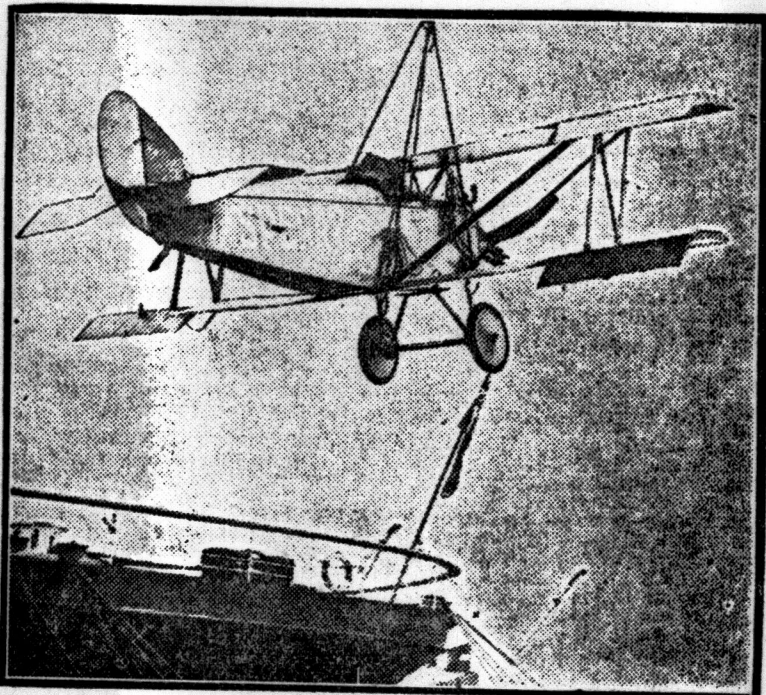

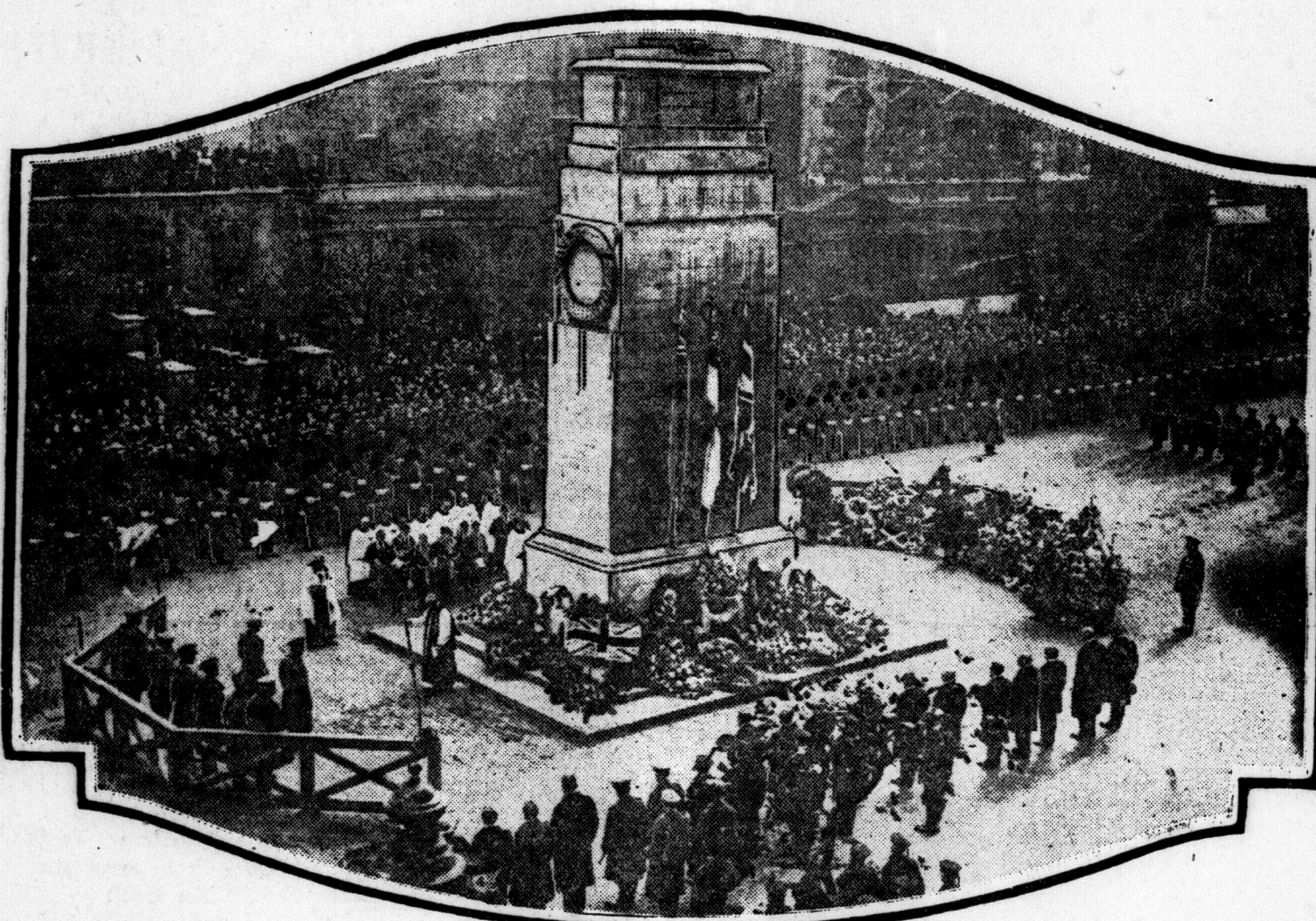

Here are the rifles being distributed to Hitler's army for the revolution that bloomed for a day—and then faded away. The arms were brought out from the city and concealed in beer wagons



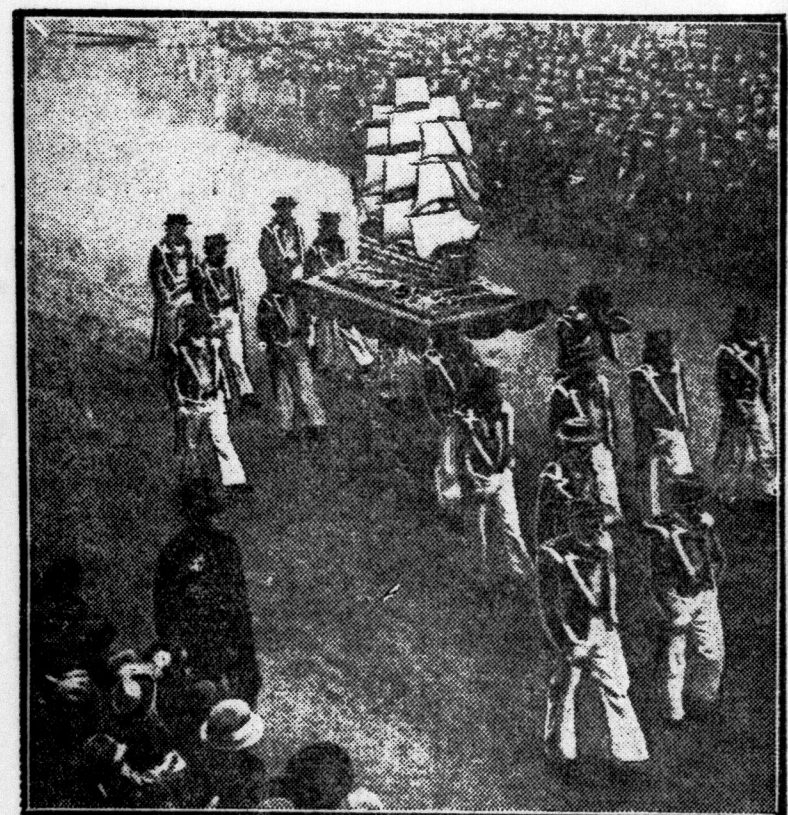
When Mr. Lloyd George arrived home he was presented with the freedom of Southampton. Students of Hartley College carried their mascot through the town to meet him

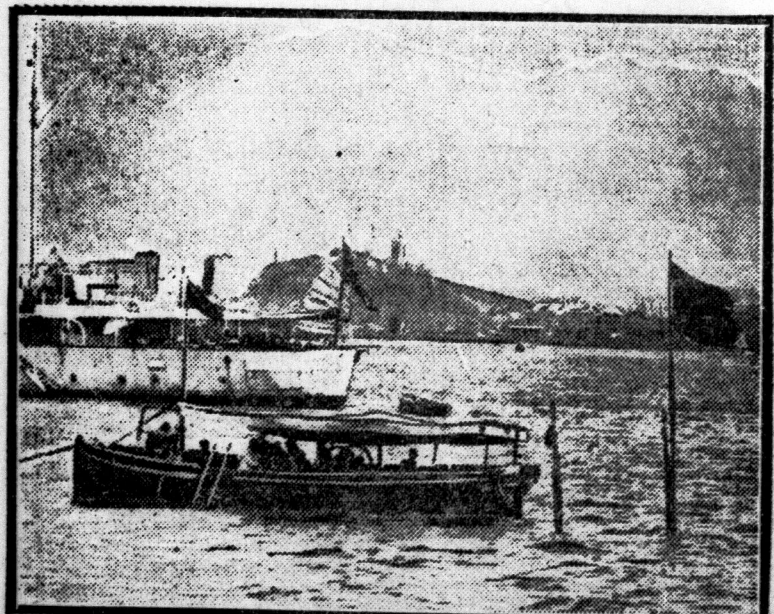
