

Let us go back to Lord Durham's celebrated report on the Canadian rebellion of Both Great Britain and the United tes were in the enjoyment of parliatary government. In both countries the ople, through representatives chosen by selves, had control over the making nd the administration of the law. But nada continued to be treated as a crown olony, having merely the shadow of contional government without the sub nce. In these provinces the executive as supreme, and the people had no power to check its misdoings. And here comes in the pith and point of the historical document ove mentioned. Lord Durham, himself whig aristocrat of the "bluest" blood, took a really sound and liberal view of the situation. He counselled the slow coaches of Downing street that the reality instead of the mere semblance of parliamentary government must be conceded to Canada, if she was to be retained within the empire. People had but to look across the border to see free institutions and popular government in full play ; and some of them the honest endeavors of any traveling salescould recollect that, whereas in the mother country their votes did count for something, here they counted for next to nothing at all. He said, in effect, that the atof domestics will tell you that the grievtempt to perpetuate the old system here, right alongside of the republican United States, was utter madness; and that if persevered in it could have but one result -the loss of Canada to the British crown. His advice was accepted, in form, but the old abuses and those who profited by them, were alike tenacious of the political soil and hard to root out; and ten years of struggle and trial had to elapse ere responsible government became in deed and truth a fact accomplished in Canada.

Now, the political necessity of forty or fifty years ago is paralleled by the commercial necessity of to-day. We have responsible government now; we no longer look with envy upon our republican neighbors, enjoying free institutions of which we are deprived. But, until a few years back we had good cause for envying them the immense commercial advantages over us which they had through their protec-
