BLOODSHED IS PREDICTED

THE NEWFOUNDLAND FISHMEN NEARING A CRISIS. Violent language at an indignation meeting—Proclamations torn down by the infuriated people—British fishermen threaten to restore their rights with arms.

St. John's, Nfld., May 20.—Advice from Bay St. George represents that the relations between the Newfoundland and the French fishermen on the disputed French shore are reaching a crisis.

The commander of the British warship Lily has issued a proclamation to the effect that he would not permit the Newfoundland fishermen to set their nets to catch herring and if they did so he would confiscate their nets.

An indignation meeting was held, at which strong language was used. Rev. Dr. Howley, protest apostle of the west coast of Newfoundland, told the commander of the British warship that he was there with the apparent intent of protecting French instead of British interests.

The proclamation, which was posted up in public places, was quickly torn down by the infuriated people. St. George's Bay is the great herring fishing ground. Some 3000 people there live almost entirely by catching herring and exporting them to Canada.

The French are given "concurrent rights" by treaty to that part of Newfoundland but claim exclusive jurisdiction, and now that they cannot get bail in other portions of Newfoundland they are asserting their claims of exclusiveness over Bay St. George and preventing themselves with bait there.

This prevents the British fishermen from getting fish, which would of course "interfere" with the French, and a British warship there prevents any interference. The people threaten to use rifles to enforce their rights.

They say they will either do that or abandon that portion of the British Empire to the French. Bloodshed is predicted. Murder of Mr. Bonaventure. PORT LADY, Costa Rica, May 20.—Rev.
