U.S. NATIONAL BANK NOTES. . Wadsworth's Bill to Authorize an Ad

Washington, Jan. 8. Mr. Wadsworth Rep., N. Y.) to-day introduced in the House a bill to authorize an additional authorizes the Secretary of the Treasury to issue United States bonds payable 50 years from April 1, 1895, bearing interest at 2 per cent. per annum, payable quarterly.
