Causapscal to Gaspe.—Application will be made next session of the Dominion Parliament for the incorporation of a company to conto be operated by any kind of power, from the I.C.R., between Causapscal and Little Metis, and Gaspe Basin, Que. The promoters ask for very wide general powers. D'Arcy Scott, Ottawa, is solicitor. In 1902 application was made for the incorporation of company to construct a railway between the same two points, but the bill was with-drawn from the consideration of the Railway Committee of the House of Commons.
