

Stromboli

The recent unusual activity of the volcano makes this picture extremely interesting. It was taken on March 8, 1907, by Mr. A. W. Robinson, of Montreal, on the way home from Egypt. Stromboli is one of the Lipari Islands, north of Sicily, and the cone rises out of the sea to a height of 3022 feet. It is notable as being the only example in Europe of a volcano in a state of constant activity. In a valley on the other side of the volcano there is a cluster of little houses.
