

Mr. Jacques Noiseux (48), born in Montreal, Quebec, as Ambassador to Syria.

Mr. Noiseux (B.A., Jean-de-Brébeuf College and Ste.-Marie College, 1959; LL.L., Montreal University, 1963; Political Science Institute, Paris, 1964; called to the Quebec Bar, 1965) joined the Department of External Affairs in 1965. He has served abroad in London, Kinshasa, Dakar and Paris. In Ottawa, he served as Deputy Director, Federal-Provincial Co-ordination in 1975; Acting Director, Press Service from 1976 to 1977; and Deputy Secretary, Government House from 1981 to 1984. Since 1984, Mr. Noiseux has been Ambassador to Lebanon.

Mr. A. Douglas Small (60), born in Collingwood, Ontario, as High Commissioner to New Zealand with concurrent accreditation to Fiji and Tuvalu.

Mr. Small (B.A., University of Toronto, 1947) joined the Department of External Affairs in 1955. He has served abroad in Bonn, Lagos, Dar-es-Salaam, and London. In Ottawa from 1974 to 1978, he has been Principal Speech writer to the Secretary of State for External Affairs; Director, East Asia Division; and Director, Pacific Affairs Division. In 1978, Mr. Small was appointed Ambassador to Pakistan. Since 1981, he has been Director General, Communications and General Services Bureau. Mr. Small replaces Mr. C.O.R. Rousseau who is returning to Ottawa.
