On motion of Mr. Diefenbaker, seconded by Mr. Churchill, Gordon Campbell Chown, Esquire, Member for the Electoral District of Winnipeg South, was appointed Chairman of Committees of the Whole House.

On motion of Mr. Diefenbaker, seconded by Mr. Churchill, Rémi Paul, Esquire, Member for the Electoral District of Berthier-Maskinongé-Delanaudière, was appointed Deputy Chairman of Committees of the Whole House.

By unanimous consent, on motion of Mr. Diefenbaker, seconded by Mr. Churchill, it was ordered,—That this House do stand adjourned until tomorrow at 2.30 p.m., notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 2(1).

By Mr. Speaker,—Report of the Parliamentary Librarian, pursuant to section 2 of the Regulations respecting the Library of Parliament (English and French), which is as follows:

To the Honourable the Speaker of the House of Commons:

The Parliamentary Librarian has the honour to submit his report for the first eight months of the year 1962. The last report was presented to both Houses on January 18, 1962.

The Joint Committee met once during the last session, on March 13, 1962 to review Library matters.

The "Selected Additions List", issued twice a month to bring to the attention of Senators and Members a choice of recent books of special interest, was continued throughout the year. A revised edition of the leaflet "How the Library of Parliament can Help Senators and Members" will be distributed shortly.

From January 1 to August 31, 1962, our staff answered 2,540 reference questions and circulated 15,869 books and periodicals. During the same period, 13,892 volumes were catalogued and classified, which brings to 181,687 the number of volumes recatalogued since the fire of 1952.

On July 7, 1962 Mr. Frank W. Matley drowned on holidays. He had served the Library faithfully for over thirty years and will be greatly missed.

On February 26, 1962 Miss A. Pamela Hardisty, Assistant Director, Reference Services, National Library, was appointed Assistant Librarian by the Civil Service Commission, to replace Mr. R. M. Hamilton who left last year.
