Discrimination may be described as a distinction, whether intentional or not, but based on grounds relating to personal characteristics of the individual or group, which has the effect of imposing burdens, obligations, or disadvantages on such individuals or group not imposed upon others, or which withholds or limits access to opportunities, benefits and advantages available to other members of society. Distinctions based on personal characteristics attributed to an individual solely on the basis of association with a group will rarely escape the charge of discrimination, while those based on an individual's merits and capabilities will rarely be so classed.

The ways to eliminate racial discrimination are known. I urge the government to master the will to grant adequate funding to achieve the goal. Together we will go further.

This decision comes at a time when Canadian agriculture is in crisis, and we should be increasing the information available to the public, not reducing it. The CBC has maintained this vital position since the 1940s.

CBC reporter George Price has filled this position for over 20 years, reporting on Canadian agriculture year in and year out. He is well known in the agricultural community and has established himself as a trustworthy and impartial reporter and media personality. It is shameful that he had to learn the news of the abolition of his position by reading it in a wire story.

Today is Rural Revitalization Day in Canada. I believe it is totally unacceptable that the agri-food sector has lost an important means of communication with the public, which needs to know what is going on in agriculture and rural Canada. It is difficult enough as it is to make consumers aware of the difficulties facing Canadian farmers and rural communities without the government chopping this important means of communication.

I call on the government to reverse this budgetary cutback at the CBC, and to reinstate this important means of communication on the agriculture industry to all Canadians.

#### MULTICULTURALISM

Mr. Marcel R. Tremblay (Québec-Est): Mr. Speaker, today, on the 21st of March, I would like to take a few moments to mention measures taken by the present government to fight racism and racial discrimination.
