ing that the route known as the Major Robinson Line or route may not be adopted for the Intercolonial Railway, but that the cheapest and most direct route to the scaboard be selected.

Of W. H. Robinson and others, of the County of York, in the Province of New Brunswick, praying for the passing of an Act to incorporate the "Bank of Fredericton."

Pursuant to the Order of the Day the Bill, intituled: "An Act to incorporate The Canada Shipping Company" was read a third time.

The question was put whether this Bill shall pass?

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Bill intituled: "An Act to declare certain "persons therein mentioned indemnified for having sat and voted as Members of the "House of Commons, while holding certain offices under the Crown," was read a third time.

The question was put whether this Bill shall pass?

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill without any amendment.

The Order of the Day being read for putting the House into a Committee of the whole on the Bill intituled, "An Act respecting the Manufacture or Importation of Cop-"per Coins or Tokens."

Hon. Mr. Campbell moved, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Chapais,

That the same be postponed until Monday next.

After Debate,

The question of concurrence being put thereon, the same was resolved in the affirmative, and

Ordered accordingly.

The Order of the Day being read for the Second Reading of the Bill, intituled: "An "Act respecting Offences against the Person."

The Honorable Mr. Campbell moved, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Mitchell,

That the said Bill be now read a second time.

After debate,

The Honorable Mr. Sanborn moved in amendment, seconded by the Honorable Mr.

McCully,

To leave out all the words after "be," and insert, "not now read a second time, but that it be resolved that at this late period of the Session, and in the absence of a large number of Senators, this Senate can not give the revision and assimilation of the Laws relating to the administration of Criminal Justice throughout the Dominion that deliberation and careful examination its importance deserves."

After a long Debate,
