A Statement of the Expenditure and Revenue for 1897.

The Board of Control held a session yes yesterday, at which a number of importan matters were under consideration. very interesting document presented was an officially compiled account of the Board's stewardship for the year. The City Treasurer's statement of the estimated revenues and expenditures for the year ending Dec. 31, 1897, is as follows:

The Civic Credit.

The report states that the credit of the city never stood higher than at the present time. During the year temporary ank loans have been procured on the most avorable terms, the average rate paid not exceeding 3% per cent. The report contin-

exceeding 3% per cent. The report continues:

"Our 3½ per cent. bonds command a good premium in Great Britain, which augurs well for the success of the forthcoming issue of debentures. The loan, no doubt, will command the attention of capitalists both in this country and abroad. The high financial credit of the city in the money markets of the world must be a matter for congratulation to the citizens of Torouto."

The report recommends, further, that the heads of the civic departments be required to furnish annually a detailed statement of city assets in the form of stores, implements, horses, carts, Fire Department plant, etc., under their charge.
